The conference typically draws over 1,200 attendees and provides an excellent opportunity for students to present current research or showcase findings from a class project. The poster session is suitable for students in urban and regional planning, architecture, landscape architecture, public administration, urban studies, environmental studies, and allied fields.

Poster Formats

Up to twelve posters will be selected for display at the conference from September 30-October 3, 2007. The official poster session presentation will take place during the Poster Session Luncheon on Monday, October 1. At least one student representing each selected poster will receive a full free conference attendance. Team projects will be acknowledged in the conference program and during the Poster Session Luncheon.

Poster Proposal Process

An interactive PDF proposal form is available for download at www.calapa.org, and must be submitted via email by close of business on May 31, 2007. All proposals will be reviewed by the Poster Review Committee, and the primary contact for each poster submission will be informed of the Committee's decision by July 13, 2007. Standard 3' x 2' sized posters are required for display, and more detailed information on logistics will be provided for selected participants by July 31, 2007.

Proposal Contents

Proposals must provide the following information:

- Poster title: A catchy phrase capturing the essence of the poster.
- Summary: A brief description for use in the conference program – not to exceed 50 words.
- Abstract: A summary of the poster – not to exceed 200 words.
- Biography: Each contributor's contact information and university affiliation.
